


“Building Bridges in a Burning World”

A **burning world** speaks to a wide state of crisis that we are living in. We find ourselves in a world ravaged by **war, hate and decaying democracy** across much of the world. Our Conference takes place during a time made increasingly turbulent by some highly impactful elections, **the European Parliament and the US Presidency**, which will undoubtedly shake up the geopolitical landscape. The motto also reflects on **the climate catastrophe** referring to a burning world in a very literal way.

Building bridges is something that reflects our commitment to fostering **strong bonds and inclusivity**. It also symbolises diversity, a free exchange of ideas, and reliability. We believe it to be crucial to spread these values given the context of our burning world. At a time when **we are surrounded by destruction, we are ready to start building**.

Fire and  are two symbols for one idea – **chaos**. Whether it be senseless bloodshed or forest fires, this chaos surrounds us, directly **harming Europe and its relations** with the world. This is something we would like to put to the torch and contribute to overcoming these issues.

Yellow represents a beam of light – hope for a world free from war and climate emergency. Between this future and our present, however, lies a void which we must brave. LITOMYŠL

Litomyšl is a beautiful historic town located on the edge of two major regions in the Czech Republic, **Bohemia and Moravia**. Although it is not the largest city, the first records of settlement date back to 981 and it became a city in 1259.

Once home to many famous Czech people, such as Smetana, Němcová and Jirásek, it is now home to **several UNESCO World Heritage Sites**. The most significant landmark of the town is the **Litomyšl Castle complex**, including the Renaissance château, riding hall, brewery and gardens. Furthermore, we must also mention other sights in the town including various churches, statues and well-preserved historic houses.

ČESKÁ TŘEBOVÁ

The Conference will take place in the **East Bohemian town** of Česká Třebová, a town on the border of Bohemia and Moravia in the **beautiful country of the Orlické Mountains foothills** and the Třebovka river valley.

The vibrant town with almost sixteen thousand inhabitants is **one of the largest in the region**. Its history dates to 1278. Not long ago, the name Česká Třebová evoked mainly the railways. Although it remains an important railway crossroad, it would be a mistake to consider it only a town of railwaymen.

Česká Třebová has become a town with **increasing attention to sports and culture**, full of green spaces, many parks and ongoing development.





TRAVEL GUIDE

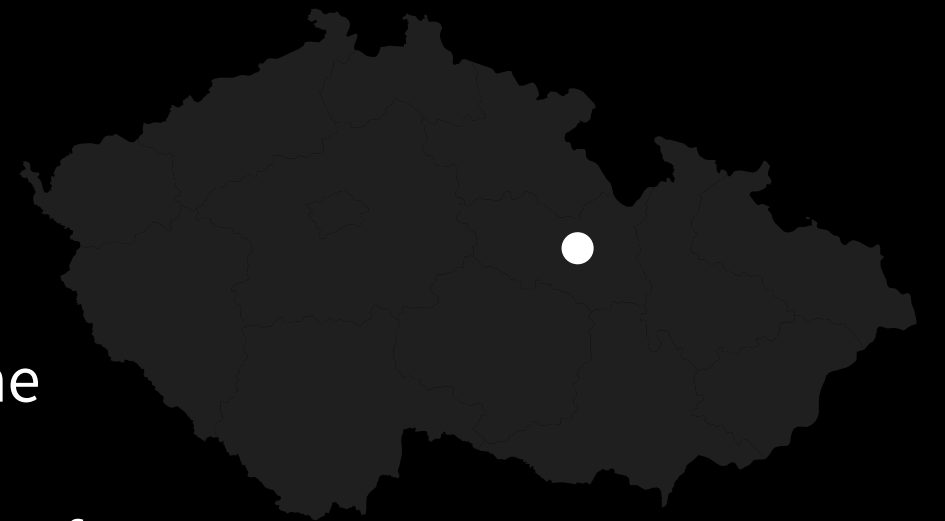
- Since the CMOJ day will take place in a different city, when travelling to the session we kindly ask you to plan your arrival to **Litomyšl on Thursday 28 November 2024 between 8:30 and 11:00 CET** but to plan your departure already from **Česká Třebová on Sunday 1 December 2024 after 19:00 CET**.

ARRIVING TO LITOMYŠL

Please plan your **arrival to Litomyšl** on Thursday 28 November 2024 between 8:30 and 11:00 CET. We will spend the whole Thursday and Friday morning in Litomyšl and then transfer ourselves by bus to Česká Třebová on Friday.

In case that you are going to Litomyšl by bus, check whether it stops at a bus stop Litomyšl, zámek, as it is the closest one to the venue. You can find connections and buy your tickets online on České dráhy (the major railway operator in the Czech Republic) or IDOS (a platform that searches for connections and also allows purchasing tickets for all types of transportation in the Czech Republic).

We recommend you **buy your tickets online in advance**, as companies usually offer a better price and sometimes free seat reservations.



SUSTAINABLE TRAVELLING

As we prepare for the upcoming EYP session, we encourage you to make it more environmentally friendly. We kindly ask you to opt for less carbon-producing means of travel, such as trains or other public transportation. This way, we not only align with the values of EYP but also take a proactive step towards addressing the pressing issue of climate change. Let's set an example by embracing sustainable travel and making our journey as ecological as possible!





FROM PRAGUE

To get to Česká Třebová from Prague it is best to take a direct train from Hlavní nádraží (Main Railway Station). You can find connections and buy your tickets online on [České dráhy](#) or [IDOS](#). A one-way ticket to Česká Třebová should cost around 117-140 CZK (4.6-5.5 EUR).

If you are flying to Prague, you will arrive to Prague airport Terminal 2. There will be signs pointing you to the exit and the bus stop.

- Take the trolleybus 59 in the direction Nádraží Veleslavín.
- Buy a ticket for 90 minutes in the ticket machine (inside of the bus) and pay with a contactless card or your phone. The ticket costs 40 CZK (about 1.6 EUR) This ticket is valid for all public transport.
- Get off at the final stop Nádraží Veleslavín (Metro A (green line)) and enter the metro.
- Take the metro in the direction Depo Hostivař and ride 6 stops, get off at Muzeum.
- At Muzeum, follow the red arrows to change to line C (red line).
- Take the metro in the direction Letňany and ride 1 stop, get off at Hlavní nádraží (Main Railway Station).
- Take the stairs to enter the Main Railway Station, then ride up the escalators, there you will find the screens with arrivals and departures, which will direct you to your platform.

FROM BRNO

Trains from Brno Hlavní nádraží (Main Train Station) take around an hour to get to Česká Třebová. You can buy your tickets on [České dráhy](#) or [IDOS](#). A one-way ticket to Česká Třebová should cost around 100 CZK (4 EUR).

FROM WIEN

Most trains from Wien can get you to Česká Třebová in 3 hours or less. You can buy your tickets on [České dráhy](#) or [IDOS](#). Your ticket can cost you anywhere from 264-550 CZK (10.5-22 EUR)

FROM KRAKOW

Although there are bus connections from Krakow to Česká Třebová, they are significantly more expensive and much longer than the train ride, so we strongly recommend taking the train. All the train connections contain a transfer. Your trip will take anywhere from 4.5 to 7 hours. You can buy your tickets on [České dráhy](#) or [IDOS](#). Your ticket can cost you anywhere from 192-335 CZK (7.65-13.3 EUR).



DEPARTURE FROM ČESKÁ TŘEBOVÁ

Plan your departures from Česká Třebová for Sunday 1 December after 19:00 CET.

TO PRAGUE

To get to Prague from Česká Třebová it is best to take a direct train to Praha Hlavní nádraží (Main Railway Station). You can find connections and buy your tickets online on [České dráhy](#) or [IDOS](#). A one-way ticket to Prague should cost around 117-140 CZK (4.6-5.5 EUR).

TO BRNO

Trains to Brno Hlavní nádraží (Main Train Station) take around an hour to get there from Česká Třebová. You can buy your tickets on [České dráhy](#) or [IDOS](#). A one-way ticket to Brno Hlavní nádraží should cost around 100 CZK (4 EUR).

TO WIEN

Most trains to Wien can get you there from Česká Třebová in 3 hours or less. You can buy your tickets on [České dráhy](#) or [IDOS](#). Your ticket can cost you anywhere from 264-550 CZK (10.5-22 EUR).

TO KRAKOW

Although there are bus connections to Krakow from Česká Třebová, they are significantly more expensive and much longer than the train ride, so we strongly recommend taking the train. All the train connections contain a transfer. Your trip will take anywhere from 4.5 to 7 hours. You can buy your tickets on [České dráhy](#) or [IDOS](#). Your ticket can cost you anywhere from 192-335 CZK (7.65-13.3 EUR).





VENUES



CMOJ

Zámecké návrší Litomyšl

This fairytale-like historical site has been a part of UNESCO Cultural Heritage since 1999. It consists of the well-known Renaissance castle, castle gardens of the noble Valdštejn family, stables, a brewery, and much more.

Accommodation

Domov mládeže SŠT Česká Třebová

These dormitories for students of the technical secondary school in Česká Třebová can accommodate up to 215 people. On campus you can find an auditorium with a projector, a gym, and even a table tennis playroom.



Teambuilding + CW

ZŠ Habrmanova

With a long history since its foundation in 1945, ZŠ Habrmanova stands in a practical position near the city centre. It annually welcomes more than 400 students.

General Assembly

Malá scéna Kulturního centra Česká Třebová

This local cultural centre is located in the premises of an Eastern Bohemian 19th century theatre. It hosts hundreds of events every year, ranging from movie screenings to photographic exhibitions.





EVENTS

Teambuildig (TB)

Teambuilding marks the first part of the programme. During the General Teambuilding, you will meet the Conference's Officials, followed by your Committee, with which you will spend the rest of the day bonding. The purpose of Teambuilding is to get to know those you will collaborate with throughout the session and to create a relaxed, friendly atmosphere, ultimately enhancing the Committee's effectiveness.

Dress code: Casual

Opening Ceremony

The Conference will officially commence with the Opening Ceremony, where you will have the opportunity to hear from distinguished guests and the session's Leadership as they deliver their speeches. Finally, the session President will formally declare the Conference open.

Eurovillage (EV)

Following the Opening Ceremony, the Eurovillage will take place. Each school Delegation will prepare traditional dishes from a country assigned to it prior to the session. When brought together, these individual meals will assemble into a feast of diverse European cuisine.

Committee Work (CW)

The Committee Work is a central component of the session. You will collaborate with your Committee to draft a resolution addressing pressing global issues, which will later be presented at the General Assembly. Throughout the process, an experienced Chairperson will offer guidance and support.

EVENTS

Panel Debate (PD)

On Saturday evening, a Panel Debate will take place, conducted in Czech, focusing on the current issues facing the European Union. During this event, you will hear insights from knowledgeable professionals in the field and have the opportunity to ask them questions, which they will address. A secondary programme covering the same topics will be organised for participants who do not speak Czech.

Dress code: Smart casual

Theme Party (TP)

On Saturday evening, you will have the opportunity to unwind after a productive day and enjoy a Theme Party.

Dress code: To be announced

General Assembly (GA)

The General Assembly will take place on the final day of the Conference. Each Committee will present and defend its resolution, engaging in debates with opposing Committees. You will deliver speeches, respond to insightful questions, and vote either for or against each resolution. A resolution will pass only if the majority of votes are in favour.

Dress code: Formal

Closing Ceremony (CC)

After the General Assembly, the Conference will conclude with the Closing Ceremony. During this event, you will hear speeches from the leaders of the Officials' Teams. Finally, the session President will formally declare the Conference closed.

THE MODULE WEEKEND

The Module Weekend is a **pre-session event for Officials** taking place shortly before the Conference. The event will incorporate a host of useful modules that will contribute to a stronger and more competent Officials Team. Apart from that, you can look forward to a wonderful evening programme. The Module Weekend will take place entirely online, contributing to higher accessibility and sustainability.

The Purpose

The Module Weekend was pioneered due to an absence of inter-team understanding that can often hurt the experience of all involved in a session, which poses an even higher risk at the regional level where many Officials are first-timers.

This online event has been designed to combat this issue, providing the time and space for Officials to learn not only about their own role at the Conference, but also the part other teams play.

Aside from that, the Module Weekend naturally contributes to Officials' training, ensuring a more efficient CMOJ day and a smoother Conference all around. It also provides an opportunity for Teambuilding and the creation of strong bonds before the session thanks to its evening programme.

The Programme and Activities

The Module Weekend will kick off on Saturday 23 November, and conclude on Sunday 24 November. The programme will start around before noon on both days and end in the evenings with more informal activities. Naturally, there will be plenty of breaks between modules, providing time for meals and to relax.

The modules will be led by Team Leaders, the Extended Leadership, the Members of the Board of the Czech National Committee, and other experienced Officials. The programme will range from 101-level introductions to various roles all the way to more general topics like application writing or welfare.

With modules out of the way, evenings will be dedicated to a more informal agenda. This will take the form of hangout calls complete with teambuilding games and fun activities. The evening programme will take advantage of the digital format of the Module Weekend leveraging tools such as breakout rooms or online games.

COMMITTEE TOPICS

AFCO

21st Century Disenfranchisement: Recent political movements across Europe and the world suggest that a large proportion of the population no longer feels represented by mainstream politics. How can European countries address citizens' belief that they have been “left behind”, while ensuring governments' accountability?

Rocking the Border: Following Brexit, issues surrounding the status of Gibraltar have re-emerged. As discussions on Gibraltar's future relationship with the EU linger without resolution, what measures can the EU adopt to avert the establishment of a “hard border” between Spain and Gibraltar?

AFET I

AFET II

Shape For All: International conflicts like those in Russia-Ukraine and Israel-Palestine have exposed the fragmented and ineffective foreign policies of EU Member States, revealing their inability to form a unified response to critical events. How can European governments become a force that protects human rights and ensures security in the most vulnerable countries in need of assistance?

Classroom Crisis: A shortage of qualified teachers in EU Member States, exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, is negatively impacting education quality and student outcomes, what measures can the EU take to assist Member States in providing high-quality education for future generations?

COMMITTEE TOPICS

Broaden the Erasmus Vibe!: According to the European Commission's recent report, Spain, Italy, and France top the list for hosting the most Erasmus students and staff, potentially constricting and devaluing the Erasmus motto of cultural exchange. Given that over 30 countries participate in these programmes, how can the EU promote Erasmus to countries with lower levels of cultural mobility and internationalisation to ensure a more balanced exchange?

Protect Us!: Given the annual 41% increase in the number of people displaced by natural disasters and ecological threats since 2020, the recognition of climate change dangers has significantly grown. Considering the New Pact on Migration and Asylum does not recognise climate stress as grounds to seek refugee status, how can the EU ensure the protection and human rights of refugees displaced by climate change?

DROI

Equal Voices, Stronger Peace: Despite the growing recognition of women's contributions to peacekeeping, only 60 out of 190 countries have a woman serving as foreign affairs minister. Given the significant underrepresentation of women in politics, especially in foreign policy and international security, how can the EU expand and enhance non-gendered approaches to peace and security?

Railways for Future: Recognising the potential of railways as a sustainable alternative for cross-border travel, what further steps can the EU take to promote carbon-neutral transport options, and improve the high-speed trains network across the continent?

TRAN

Fuelling Change: Despite the significant role carbon taxes play in reducing greenhouse gas emissions, they remain a divisive issue politically. With this in mind, what stance should the EU take regarding a possible worldwide fossil fuel tax?

EVENT SAFETY POLICY

To ensure that the 16th Regional Selection Conference of EYP CZ Česká Třebová is a safe, respectful, and friendly environment for all participants, there will be two Event Safe Persons (ESPs) available before, during, and after the Conference. This role will be fulfilled by **Zuzana Augustová** and **Xeniya Kistanova**.

You can reach out to an Event Safe Person if you observe or experience any behaviour that is inappropriate, offensive, or uncomfortable, or in case of personal or work conflict. They will provide a **safe and discreet space** to either resolve a conflict between two people or be there for an individual. An Event Safe Person will **always help you only to the extent you wish**.

Alcohol Policy

All participants under the age of 18 are prohibited by the law of the Czech Republic from buying and drinking alcohol. All adult participants are allowed to buy and consume alcohol with up to 15% alcohol volume. Mixed drinks where any component of the drink has over 15% alcohol volume are also prohibited. Adult participants may consume alcohol only in the evenings after the end of the programme and are expected to do so responsibly.

Smoking and Vaping Policy

Smoking and vaping is prohibited for all underage participants during the session. Additionally, smoking and vaping is also prohibited in all indoor spaces. If you are of age, you are allowed to smoke outdoors, yet keep in mind that there are still some restrictions, such as near official buildings and public transport stops.

- Travel insurance if you are travelling from abroad
- Signed Code of Conduct and picture of it in your phone
- Clothes in agreement with the Dress Code above (also bring some warmer/ outdoor clothes as some parts of the Teambuilding might be done outside)
- A reusable mug or 50 CZK as a deposit for a cup
- Ideally a laptop or a tablet or notebook to write in
- Chargers for all your electronic devices
- Toiletries and a towel
- Money in cash for the session Merch you have ordered

Currency

- 1 EUR = 25.33 CZK
- 1 CZK = 0.039 EUR

In the Czech Republic, most businesses accept payment by card. Please take that into account if you are considering exchanging a larger sum of Czech currency, as it might not be necessary.





USEFUL TIPS

Common items' prices:

- Coca-Cola (bottle): 30 CZK = 1.184 EUR
- Red Bull (250 ml): 40 CZK = 1.578 EUR
- Meal in a restaurant: 200–300 CZK = 8–12 EUR
- Water bottle (750 ml): 15 CZK = 0.6 EUR

Currency Exchange

If you need to exchange money, do so at an exchange office and make sure you are getting the right exchange rate, as some places might want to rip you off. This is common, especially in Prague. Here are some recommended exchange offices with good reviews:

Alternatively, you can withdraw Czech crowns directly from trusted ATMs if your bank allows for it or if you use services like Revolut. When withdrawing from ATMs, be sure to use one operated by a bank and not part of the Euronet network.

Other important information:

- Thanks to EU regulations, if you have a SIM registered anywhere within the EU, calling should cost the same as if you were in your home country.
- Drinking and smoking in the Czech Republic is strictly prohibited by law as well as by the Code of Conduct to anyone under 18 years old.
